HISTORY OF EUCHARISITC PROCESSIONS FOR CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY

"Very early (in the fourteenth century) the custom developed of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a splendid procession through the town after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. This was encouraged by the popes, some of whom granted special indulgences to all participants. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.

"During the later Middle Ages these processions developed into splendid pageants of devotion and honor to the Blessed Sacrament. They are still publicly held, and often with the ancient splendor, in Italy, France, Spain, Portugal, Austria, Belgium, Ireland, in the Catholic sections of Germany, Holland, Switzerland, Canada, Hungary, and in the Slavic countries and South America. Sovereigns and princes, presidents and ministers of the state, magistrates, members of trade and craft guilds, and honor guards of the armed forces accompany the liturgical procession while the church bells peal, bands play sacred hymns, and the faithful kneel in front of their homes to adore the Eucharistic Lord." 
LASTING SUPPER

Reflection on Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

The Last Supper, where Jesus gave us His most precious Body and Blood, takes place within the Jewish tradition of Passover, a feast which celebrates God's liberation of His people from bondage. We can also call this event the "Lasting Supper," as its celebration has continued throughout the ages, nourishing God's people and freeing us from all that binds us.

How can we keep our weekly celebration of the Eucharist from becoming routine where we do and experience more than go through the motions? I believe we can do so by focusing on how we prepare for Sunday Mass. Key to our participation is the "Offertory" of the Mass, and we can prepare for each Mass by recalling just what I am offering, in particular, at this Mass, in this moment. Rather than prepare our offering as a kind of Memo to God with all that we need help with (which treats God as my assistant) right now, make your offering an admission of what it is that "binds" you at this time. Perhaps it is an addiction, a bad habit that I cling to, a refusal to open my heart to someone, a harmful attitude. Offer it on the altar with the bread and wine, and ask God to transform you, to liberate you from the bondage. The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is the grace that liberates!

SAINT CHARLES LWANGA AND COMPANIONS

Saint of the Day: June 3

Patron Saint of: Youth and Catholic Action on Africa

One of 22 Ugandan martyrs, Charles Lwanga is the patron of youth and Catholic action in most of tropical Africa. He protected his fellow pages, aged 13 to 30, from the sexual demands of the Bagandan ruler, Mwanga, and encouraged and instructed them in the Catholic faith during their imprisonment for refusing the ruler's demands.

Charles first learned of Christ's teachings from two retainers in the court of Chief Mawulugungu. While a catechumen, he entered the royal household as assistant to Joseph Mukaso, head of the court pages.

On the night of Mukaso's martyrdom for encouraging the African youths to resist Mwanga, Charles requested and received Baptism. Imprisoned with his friends, Charles' courage and belief in God inspired them to remain chaste and faithful.

For his own unwillingness to submit to the immoral acts and his efforts to safeguard the faith of his friends, Charles was burned to death at Namugongo on June 3, 1886, by Mwanga's order.

When Pope Paul VI canonized these 22 martyrs on October 18, 1964, he also made reference to the Anglican pages martyred for the same reason.

Like Charles Lwanga, we are all teachers and witnesses to Christian living by the examples of our own lives. We are all called upon to spread the Word of God, whether by word or deed. By remaining courageous and unshakable in our faith during times of great moral and physical temptation, we live as Christ lived.

ARE YOU REGISTERED AT ST. FRANCIS PARISH?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a

commitment to the life of that specific parish. Often, people come to us and request a sacrament, ask to be a godparent, volunteer to help with a liturgical ministry, or have another need and are surprised to learn they aren't registered as an active member of the parish. Once someone is 18-25 years of age, he/she should register on his/her own in the parish even if he/she still lives at home with parents who are registered. Ministries at any parish are driven by the number of registered households and the makeup of those households. This allows the parish to make decisions about the type of faith formation, social activities, and outreach needed to ensure a thriving community. If you have questions about this, please contact the Parish Office. Staff members will be happy to check your registration status for you.


