
Reflection on Mark 6:1-6

I heard this so long ago that I can't remember who first said it: "The role of the prophet is to comfort the disturbed and to disturb the comfortable." This certain truth comes through in this weekend's readings.

God is sending His prophet Ezekiel to the Israelites who are, as God describes, "hard of face and obstinate of heart," and quite comfortably so! Stay tuned for how this "rebellious" house is disturbed by the prophet.

Jesus goes home, only to discover that "a prophet is not without honor except in his native place." How is it that these folks are so complacent in the sure comfort of "knowing" who Jesus is, and knowing to whom He is related? Their astonishment at the wisdom and mighty deeds of this hometown boy ultimately leads to them taking "offense at him." The dynamic of this transition, from astonishment to offense, may seem strange on the surface, until we consider how often we become fearful in life of any kind of change. As the townspeople go on about knowing His relatives, we hear them arguing from the familiar, the known, the comfortable. With Jesus, the status quo has been changed. Such disruption brings resentment and spells danger.

Perhaps this is why Jesus so often says, "Don't be afraid." He knows that the wisdom and mighty deeds He showers in each of our lives will change us and change the way we relate to each other. Unless we are too comfortable to be disturbed by grace.

SAINT BENEDICT

Saint of the Day: July 11 Patron Saint of: Europe, Kidney Disease

Benedict was born into a distinguished family in central Italy, studied at Rome, and early in life was drawn to monasticism. At first he became a hermit, leaving a depressing world.

He soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks chose Benedict as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still, the shift from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, and permanent worship in one house. Finally, he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world – Monte Cassino.

The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under a common abbot. Benedictine asceticism is known for its moderation, and Benedictine charity has always shown concern for the people in the surrounding countryside. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was gradually brought under the Rule of St. Benedict.

Today, the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation encompassing the men and women of the Order of St. Benedict; and the Cistercians, men and women of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance.

The Church has been blessed through Benedictine devotion to the liturgy, not only in its actual celebration with rich and proper ceremony in the great abbeys, but also through the scholarly studies of many of its members.

BISHOP PROVIDES ANOINTING DIRECTIVES

Our next Anointing of the Sick is scheduled for Saturday, 7/6 and Sunday, 7/7 following the Masses. In the past, we've invited anyone in need of the Sacrament forward, but recently Bishop Fernandes has offered some clarifications on practices surrounding the reception of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Here are some important points to keep in mind regarding the reception of this Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick here at St. Francis:

- 1. Canon Law and the Ritual stipulate that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for those who, having reached the age of reason, are in danger of death, whether because of illness or old age (c. 1004). The second structure of the second s
- 1004). Those who do not meet these criteria, such as infants, young children prior to the age of reason, and those who lack a serious illness that places them in danger of death, are not to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. This includes even those who, though undergoing elective surgery, are not seriously ill. The administration of anesthesia does not constitute a grave illness.2. The aged and infirm may be anointed on account of the danger of death or the beginning of the danger of death.
- 3. Some types of mental sickness are now classified as serious. Those who are judged to have a serious mental illness and now would be strengthened by the Sacrament may be anointed.
- 4. The appropriate sacraments for dealing with "interior woundedness" are the Sacrament of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.
- 5. Anointing within Mass is to be celebrated strictly according to the norms found in PCS, 131-134. In particular:
 - a. Not all in attendance at Masses where the Sacrament of the Anointingof the Sick is celebrated are to be invited indiscriminately to be anointed but only those whose illness is of a serious nature.
- b. Only those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age are proper subjects for the Sacrament.

We will follow these clarifications when we are called upon to visit parishioners in the hospital, nursing homes, homebound, and when we offer this Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at Masses.
