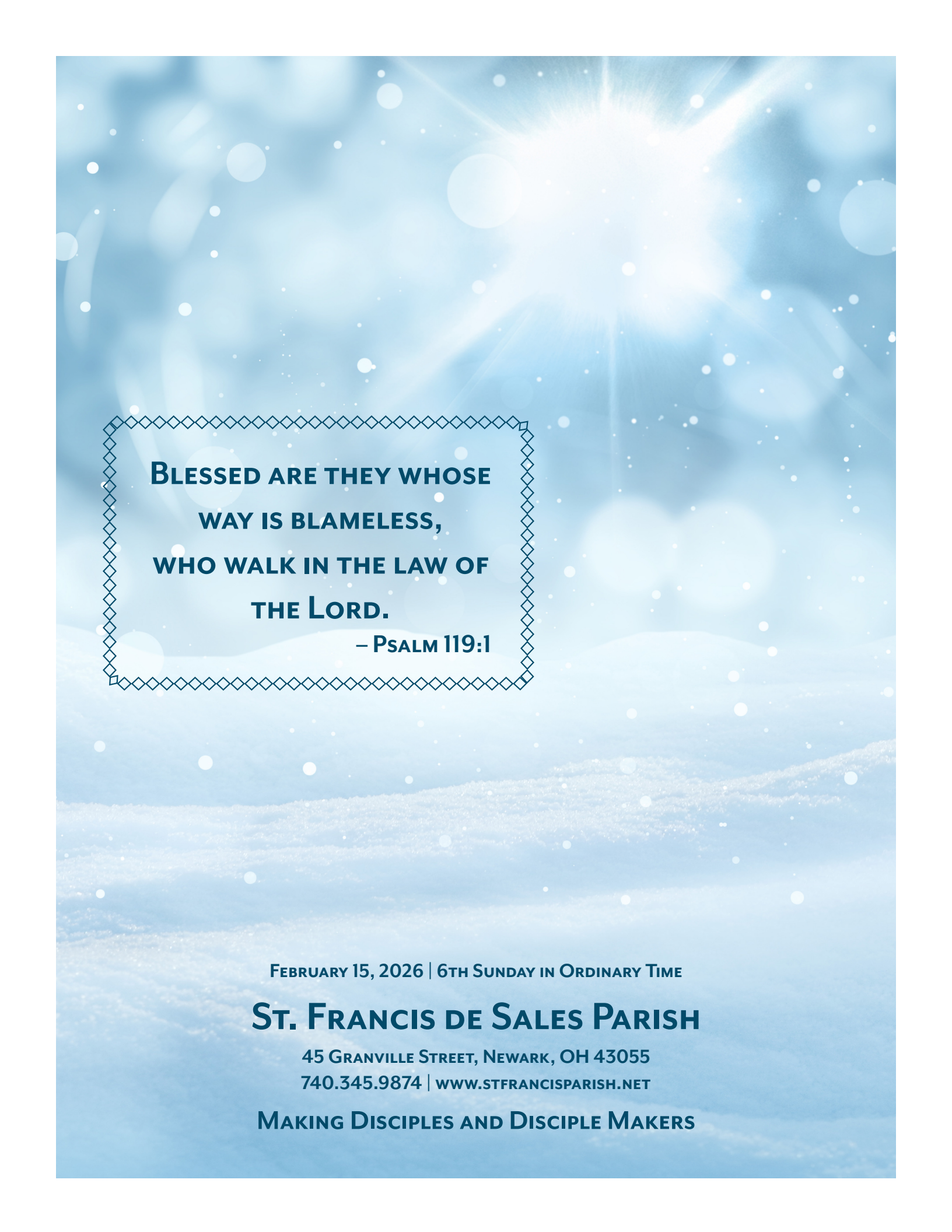

GREATEST COMMANDMENT

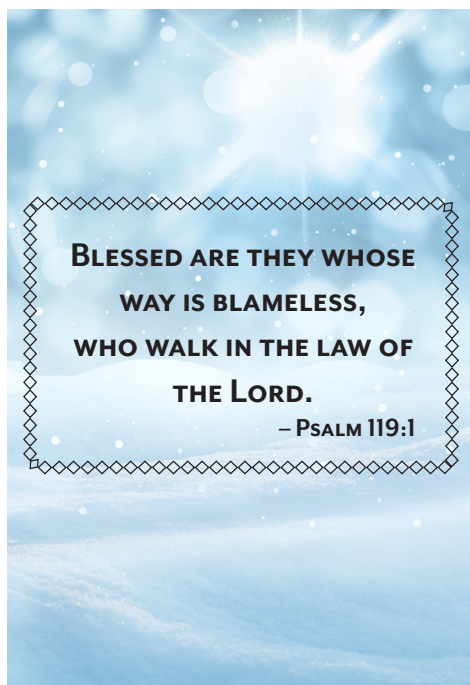
Reflection on Matthew 5:17-37

The Sermon on the Mount began with Jesus' proclamation of the Beatitudes, and continued last Sunday with Jesus calling us salt and light. Today, the sermon continues as Jesus teaches His disciples a new way of observing the commandments. In his Gospel, Matthew is keen to present Jesus as the new Moses, the great teacher, who instructs with new and forceful authority.

We first hear that everything in the law will not be abolished but fulfilled in Jesus. We can interpret this within the context of Jesus' central teaching on the law and the prophets, what we know as "the Great Commandment." Love of God and love of neighbor are, Jesus instructs, the fulfillment of the law and the prophets.

We can hear these "you have heard it said ... but what I say to you" statements of Jesus regarding the Ten Commandments given by God through Moses, as a movement from exterior observation to interior disposition. Our observance, indeed our fulfillment of God's laws, involves not only behavioral compliance, but also interior attention to the motivations, judgements, thoughts, urges of the will, that give rise to speech and action. All of this scrutiny goes to the movement of our hearts, in a word, love.

SAINT PETER DAMIAN

Saint of the Day: February 21

Patron Saint of insomnia and sleep difficulties

Saint Peter escaped poverty and the neglect of his own brother when his other brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, took him under his wing. His brother sent him to good schools and Peter became a professor.

Soon, he decided to leave his teaching and give himself completely to prayer with the Benedictines of the reform of Saint Romuald at Fonte Avellana. They lived two monks to a hermitage. Peter was so eager to pray and slept so little that he soon suffered from severe insomnia. He found he had to use some prudence in taking care of himself. When he was not praying, he studied the Bible.

The abbot commanded that when he died Saint Peter Damian should succeed him. Abbot Saint Peter founded five other hermitages. He encouraged his brothers in a life of prayer and solitude and wanted nothing more for himself.

Pope Stephen IX made Saint Peter Damian the cardinal-bishop of Ostia. He worked hard to wipe out simony – the buying of church offices – and encouraged his priests to observe celibacy and urged even the diocesan clergy to live together and maintain scheduled prayer and religious observance. He wished to restore primitive discipline among religious and priests, warning against needless travel, violations of poverty, and too comfortable living.

He asked often to be allowed to retire as cardinal-bishop of Ostia, and finally Pope Alexander II consented. Saint Peter Damian was happy to become once again just a monk, but he was still called to serve as a papal legate. When returning from such an assignment in Ravenna, he was overcome by a fever. With the monks gathered around him saying the Divine Office, he died on February 22, 1072. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.

I'm praying for all of us that this will be a holy and fruitful Lent. Starting this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday, we have the opportunity to embrace the three traditional penitential practices of fasting, prayer and almsgiving as we walk with the Lord during His 40 days in the desert. My best Lents have been those where my Lenten observances didn't just stop altogether at Easter, but continued to shape my life after Easter as well. Remember, it's not about white knuckling it for forty days just to be relieved come Easter. It's about growing in love with Jesus intentionally for forty days! Here are just a couple of suggestions to get you thinking about what you may take on this Lent to grow in your relationship with the Lord: **PRAYING:** do the Pray40 Challenge on Hallow, start the Bible in a Year with Fr. Mike, choose a spiritual book to read and pray with it through Lent, pray a daily Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.

FASTING: give up your favorite streaming platform/TV, fast from your preference in group activities, fast from the snooze button.

ALMSGIVING: use your talents to bless someone in your life, spend time with a homebound person you know, make a donation to Mary's Meals or another Catholic charity, give away clothes or other unused possessions. – Fr. Tom

We are proud of our players and cheerleaders. Congratulations to Coach Adams, Coach Urdarovski and the entire 7th grade team.

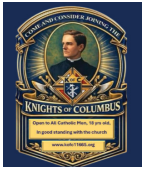


THE ROBOTICS TEAM DOES IT AGAIN!

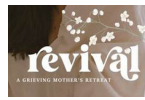

THE OFFICIAL PILGRIM RELIC OF ST. CARLO ACUTIS COMES TO COLUMBUS

The First Class pilgrim relic is 6cm in length and 2cm high and preserved in a reliquary 33cm high and 17cm wide; and is carried worldwide by the Diocese of Assisi, as sole custodian of the relics of Saint Carlo Acutis, and respecting Church guidelines.

It is a section of the Saint's pericardium, the membrane that surrounds the heart. This is a sac filled with water that encloses the heart and the great vessels, holding them in place and protecting the body's most important organ. The relic, therefore, is of major importance physiologically.

The pericardium also contains deep spiritual meaning. The heart is the body's most important organ; it is also the seat of our sentiments and actions. From the heart is born and lives our relationship with the Lord: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart" (Dt 6:5, Mt 22:37).

Moreover, when the side of Jesus was pierced on the Cross, "blood and water immediately flowed out" (Jn 19:34). Life giving blood, symbol of the Eucharist – to which Carlo Acutis was especially attached as his "highway to Heaven" – came from Christ's Sacred Heart; water, symbol of Baptism – "the basis of the whole Christian life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1213) – likely came from the Lord's pericardium.

Saint Carlo Acutis desired a living relationship with Jesus from a very young age. He wished to receive his First Holy Communion when only seven years of age and on that day told his parents: "Always to be united to Jesus. This is my programme of life." He protected and nurtured this most important of relationships with his "spiritual" pericardium of five practices or appointments: frequent reception of the Eucharistic Jesus, Adoration, spiritual direction and Confession, devotion to the Blessed Mother and the saints, and acts of charity. It led him and can lead us to be saints, living just as he lived.

Concluding his homily to one million young people gathered in Rome for the Jubilee of Youth on August 3, 2025, Pope Leo XIV recommended specifically Saint Carlo's "programme of life" and his five steps as the way to holiness: "Jesus is our hope ... Let us remain united to him, let us remain in his friendship, always, cultivating it through prayer, Adoration, Eucharistic Communion, frequent Confession, and generous charity, following the examples of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis. Aspire to great things, to holiness, wherever you are. Do not settle for less.

"You will then see the light of the Gospel growing every day, in you and around you. I entrust you to the Virgin Mary, Our Lady of Hope." In St. Peter's Square for the Mass and Canonization of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis (September 7, 2025), the Holy Father spoke again of the five steps to being a saint: "Both Pier Giorgio and Carlo cultivated their love for God and for their brothers and sisters through simple acts, available to everyone: daily Mass, prayer, and especially Eucharistic Adoration. Carlo used to say: 'In front of the sun, you get a tan. In front of the Eucharist, you become a saint!' And again: 'Sadness is looking at yourself; happiness is looking at God. Conversion is nothing more than shifting your gaze from below to above; a simple movement of the eyes is enough.' Another essential practice for them was frequent Confession. Carlo wrote: 'The only thing we really have to fear is sin'; and he marveled because – in his own words – "people are so concerned with the beauty of their bodies and do not care about the beauty of their souls." Finally, both had great devotion to the saints and to the Virgin Mary, and they practiced charity generously. Pier Giorgio said: 'Around the poor and the sick, I see a light that we do not have.' He called charity 'the foundation of our religion' and, like Carlo, he practiced it above all through small, concrete gestures, often hidden, living what Pope Francis called 'a holiness found in our next-door neighbors.'"
