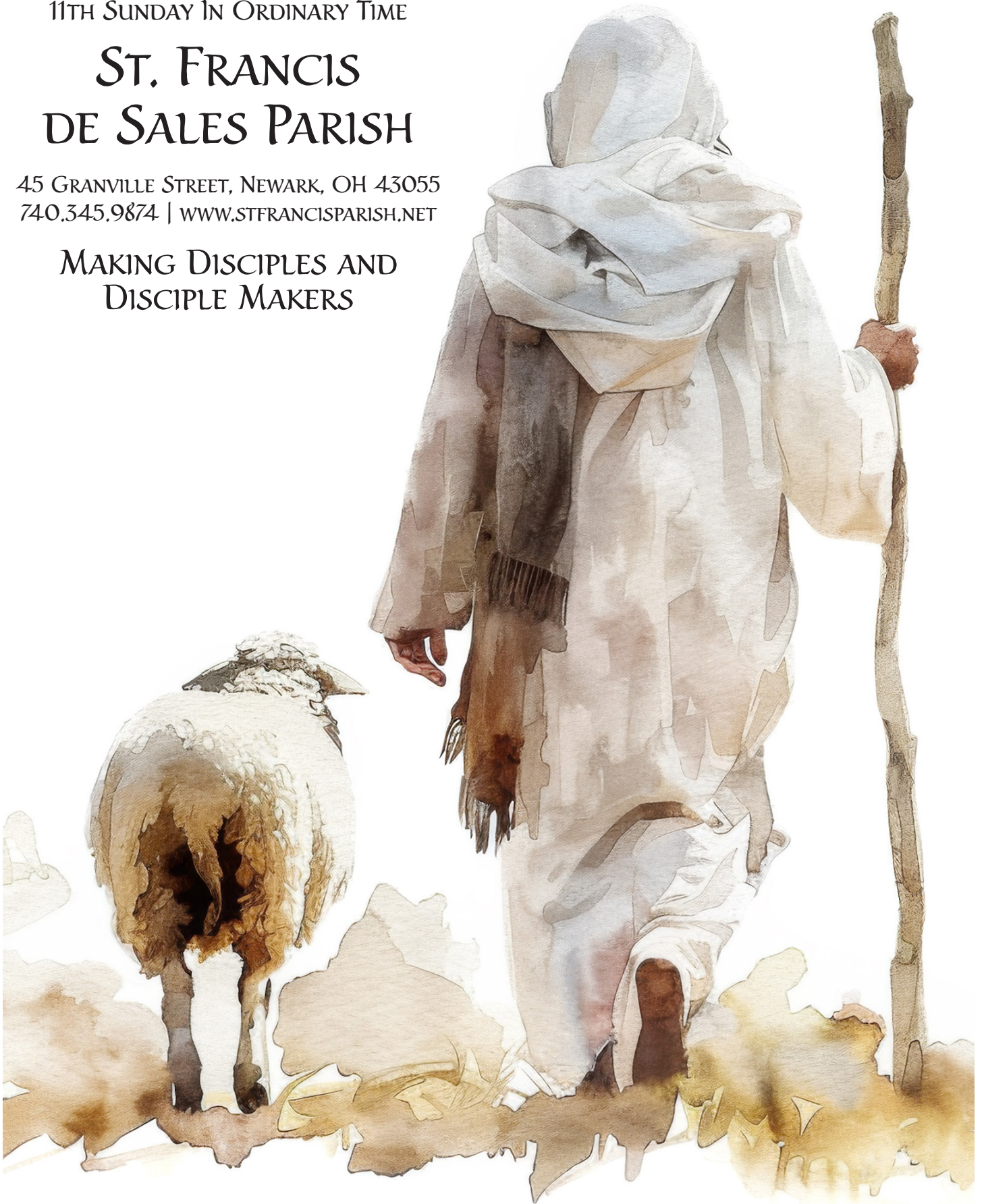

DISCIPLESHIP

Reflection on Matthew 9:36–10:8

A friend's son, who had a passion for building things as a child, followed that passion as a young adult into an apprenticeship to a master carpenter that lasted for several years. His Dad and I watched with fascination and pride as this young man learned the trade and became himself a master craftsman. Such a process takes time, patience, willingness to learn, openness to be stretched.

So it is with discipleship in Jesus. As Jesus sends out His twelve disciples in today's Gospel, they are very much still in apprenticeship. Even though there is an urgency to the mission, as expressed by Jesus' pity at the sight of the crowds in such need of shepherding, the disciples are instructed to go only "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," and not yet to the Gentiles. Our on-the-job-training, even in ministry, in discipleship, usually begins in the shallow end of the pool, where we test our skills, learn how to apply them, take constructive criticism and adjust appropriately as we go.

SAINT JOHN FRANCIS REGIS

Saint of the Day: June 16

Patron Saint of Lacemakers, Embroiderers, and Medical Social Workers

Born into a family of some wealth, John Francis Regis was so impressed by his Jesuit educators that he himself wished to enter the Society of Jesus. He did so at age 18. Despite his rigorous academic schedule, he spent many hours in chapel, often to the dismay of fellow seminarians who were concerned about his health. Following his ordination to the priesthood, John Francis undertook missionary work in various French towns.

While the formal sermons of the day tended toward the poetic, his discourses were plain. But they revealed the fervor within him and attracted people of all classes. Father Regis especially made himself available to the poor. Many mornings were spent in the confessional or at the altar celebrating Mass; afternoons were reserved for visits to prisons and hospitals.

Various forms of Protestantism were thriving in some cases while a general indifference toward religion was evident in other instances. For three years, Father Regis traveled throughout the diocese, conducting missions in advance of a visit by the bishop. He succeeded in converting many people and in bringing many others back to religious observances.

The last four years of John Francis Regis' life were spent preaching and organizing social services, especially for prisoners, the sick and the poor. In the autumn of 1640, Father Regis sensed that his days were coming to a conclusion. He settled some of his affairs and prepared for the end by continuing to do what he did so well: speaking to the people about the God who loved them. On December 31, he spent most of the day with his eyes on the crucifix. That evening, he died. His final words were: "Into thy hands I commend my spirit."

John Francis Regis was canonized in 1737.

WHAT REALLY IS A VIGIL MASS?

You may have noticed that our Mass Schedule in this bulletin has a slight change regarding Saturday evening Mass; it is no longer listed as a Vigil Mass. Here’s an excerpt from an article from Fr. Paul Keller, O.P. and Director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Diocese of Columbus that was published in *The Catholic Times* on 9/3/2025 to explain that correction: *A Saturday evening Mass is not really a “vigil” Mass unless it happens to be the Saturday night before Easter Sunday or the night before special solemnities in the Church. The word vigil comes from the Latin vigilia, meaning a watchfulness, staying awake, being alert. At a vigil Mass, we are watching for the actual day of the feast to arrive. Vigil Masses mark very important times for us to be alert to God’s power in our lives. The typical Saturday evening Mass is properly referred to as a Mass of Anticipation or an Anticipated Sunday Mass. When Saturday evening Masses became common, they received the wrong name: Vigil. And, unfortunately, the name has stuck. As we learned with the update on our posture during the liturgy (see our bulletin from 1/25/26), it’s always good to keep in step with direction from our Diocesan leadership.*
